Jayna notes changes that occurred since the last program review in 2016. In 2019, with the emergence of bachelor options in the area, the Program focused on an Associate of Arts pathway for students wishing to more seamlessly transfer to a NSHE four-year college or university with junior standing toward a bachelor's degree. The Program partners with UNR's Graphic Design BFA and NSC/TMCC's Graphic Arts and Media Technology 3+1 BA degree. A challenge is the AA pathway does not give an emphasis in Graphic Design, which then does not count toward Program numbers.

The AAS in Graphic Design was updated to better support transfer even though it is more of a career $^{\rm +}$
